Dear Friends in Christ,

First, we, (Pastors Sheryl and Chris) want to thank everyone for their concern about Pastor Sheryl's Father. His health is failing, and the family recently had to make some decisions regarding his care. At the present, he is now in a care facility with the goal of rehab. More decisions will probably have to be made, which means lots of phone calls, texts, etc. and probably a few more trips to Colorado Springs. During this time , we ask your patience and understanding as we try to cover all the bases, in case some things might fall through the 'cracks'. Fortunately, Sheryl does have two brothers, who are actively involved as well, along with her Mother.

After we got the phone call from Sheryl's brother, absorbed the news about her father, we braced ourselves for the worst case scenario as Sheryl headed off to be with her family. And yet, reflecting back on Jack's life (Jack being Sheryl's dad) the family feels blessed that he has had 84 years of relatively good health and personally its been a blessing to have him be a part of my life for nearly 25 years. But as I say that, I also recall Jack had several siblings, most whom never made it past 65 and none that I ever met. So it raises the question, "Are their children (meaning Sheryl's cousins) not as blessed because their parents did not make it to 84?"

Or the flip side of this question. Right after church, on January 20th, at Holy Apostles', Nick Sakurada got a call that his brother, Masumi, had died. Masumi would have turned 102 the next day. Is the Sakurada family more blessed than us?

Let's take this further. Not long ago I was flipping through my Facebook feed, when I came across a video post. It showed a young boy being celebrated with confetti and applause as he walked down a hospital hallway toward a bell. He reached up and rang the bell celebrating that he was cancer free in the new year. The string of comments were upbeat and congratulatory. But then I came across this one: *Wonderful for this young man, my son died in October*...ouch.

Which got me thinking. While not trying to put a damper on the celebrating of '*blessings*' of health and long life, the corollary isn't that losing someone before their 'prime' or even an infant, means that one is '*not blessed*'. The beatitudes remind us even though we weep, even though we are poor, even though we are weak, we are blessed, because God is with us. Jesus looked over that downtrod-den mass below him, had compassion and called them blessed.

Yes, we give thanks for Jack's 84 years, and what time is yet to come. I also give thanks for my cousin who just passed away in her 60's and I give thanks for a cousin I never knew having only lived 4 days, because every breath we take and have is a gift and blessing from God. So, give thanks for that breath you just took and give thanks for the next. Because God is with you. Blessed are you, Pastor Chris
