Holy Apostles "Grapevine"



"We want our cake and we want it now!" That might be a good motto for today's world. With instant everything from text messaging to iced tea, everything is now on demand. Nothing new here, as preachers of the gospel, we have often raised a critique to our impatient society. I'm including myself here. Just the other day, I was in a 'big box store' fuming because there were three people ahead of me in the check out line, and I couldn't understand why they didn't open another register. I accept the fact that I am caught up in this push for the 'now'.

We may think this is a modern malady, but the reality is humankind has always been impatient. The children of Israel couldn't wait a day in the wilderness for God to do something and it didn't get any better. In Isaiah 9:1-4, the writer speaks of God's salvation coming. At this point in history, Judah is the only thing left of the nation of Israel. The writer envisions the people of Israel in a time of oppression calling out for God's redemption. Yet the writer doesn't speak of God coming to them, but to the northern areas of Naphtali and Zebulon. That is, the writer is likening God's saving work to the rising sun. First it appears in the east and then spreads across the land. God's salvation won't come immediately to Judah, it will progress and it will take time. God's people wanted God to act now, God was telling them, "Be patient."

Be patient and know that God is at work. Patience is a supply chain issue for most of us, we wonder what the holdup is, where the bottleneck is and why we can't get things moving, is the growing complaint. It doesn't make sense there should be a shortage of baby formula for instance (yes, I listened to a report on that while I was exercising. February is a good month to remind ourselves to be patient. February, a short month we say, soon it shall pass and give way to the ever changing winds of March. Yes, February will pass and spring will come. May this be a reminder that God is at work—is on the horizon bringing God's work of salvation to fruition. In the mean time—yup! practice patience.
